


Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

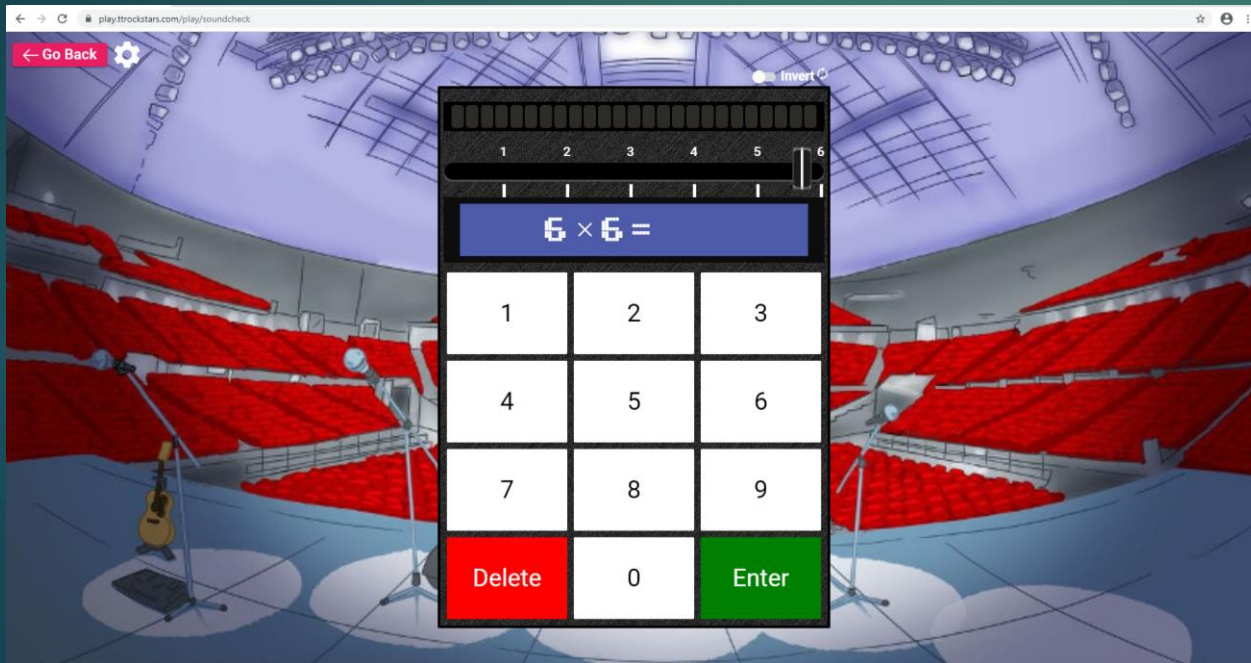

What is the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)?

- ▶ Determines whether pupils can fluently recall their times tables up to 12 .
- ▶ On-screen multiplication tables check.
- ▶ Consists on 25 questions.
- ▶ Children have 6 seconds to answer each question.

How does it work?

- ▶ Similar format to the 'Soundcheck' game on Times Tables Rock Stars.



When is the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)?

- ▶ It is a Year 4 test.
- ▶ The children will sit the check in June.

What will happen with the results?

- ▶ Your child's score will be shared with you with their end of year report.

What are we doing in school to prepare?

- ▶ Daily times tables practice – teaching and quizzing.
- ▶ Times Table Rock Stars homework.
- ▶ A ‘mock check’ will be taken before June to familiarise the children with the software.

How can you support at home?

- ▶ Times Tables Rock Stars games.
- ▶ Children are familiar with this software.
- ▶ Little and often supports retention and retrieval.
- ▶ The 'Sound Check' option is similar to the check but the other options are good for practice, too.



How can you support your child at home? (cont)

- ▶ Practising times tables by rote (chanting of each multiplication table).
- ▶ Asking your child times tables questions out of order, such as 'What's 11×12 ? What's 5×6 ?'
