Summer Term 1

We're looking forward to a busy and exciting Summer Term in Year 1.
Here's what your child will be learning this half term:

Maths

- We will be learning about multiplication and division using practical resources.
- Exploring fractions (halves and quarters).
- Working with numbers to 100, including counting, ordering and comparing.

Writing

- Writing instruction texts (e.g. how to do something).
- Creating setting descriptions using exciting vocabulary.
- Focusing on sentence structure, punctuation and handwriting.

Reading

- We will read and explore:
 - Here we Are - Oliver Jeffers
 - The Lion Inside - Rachel Bright
- Children will develop comprehension skills, vocabulary and discussion.
- Continued daily phonics (RWI) to support reading fluency.
- Preparing for the Phonics Screening Check.



Across the Curriculum

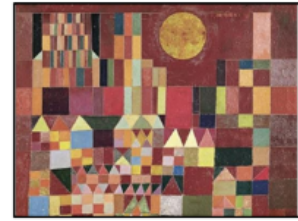
In Geography we will use and draw simple maps and explore our school and local area through fieldwork.

In Science we will observe seasonal and weather changes and learn about plants and their parts.

We will use laptops to create and edit our own digital writing and our music will be inspired by fantasy and adventure.

We will explore different materials and build a small model house in DT.

We will create collage artwork using a range of materials, taking inspiration from the work of Paul Klee.

In PSHE Education we will learn how to keep our bodies healthy and continue to learn how to stay safe online.

In RE we will explore the question: Who do Christians say made the world?

In PE we will be doing yoga and developing striking and fieldwork skills outdoors.

Home Learning

- Read with your child 3-5 times a week and encourage them to use Fred Talk to blend unfamiliar words.
- Practise RWI sounds little and often to build confidence for the Phonics Screening Check and help your child read more fluently.
- Practise number facts (using Numbots) and counting to 100.

Enrichment

- Outdoor learning and fieldwork around the school grounds.
- Opportunities for creative art and DT projects.
- Continued reading for pleasure with engaging class texts.

Optional Activities

- Draw and label a map of your home or local area.
- Practise halving objects (e.g. sharing food or toys).
- Go on a nature walk and spot signs of the season or plant something at home.
